





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SCIOTO COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH MINUTES

December 10, 2021

1. **Approve the minutes of previous board meeting.** Motion to approve– Christy Sherman; Second – Sean Sturgill. All voted in favor.
2. **Public Comment: No one in attendance**
3. **Approve Financial Report and payment of the bills.** Motion to approve – Christy Sherman; Second – Sean Sturgill. All voted in favor.

5. **Nursing Report – Tracey Henderson, Director**

COVID-19:

Cases:

Total for County and City combined as of 12/9/21, per the ODH website, is 12,727. This is 928 new cases over the past four weeks (compared to 719 the previous 34 weeks). So case numbers are rising again. We have had 5987 cases since July 1, when the delta variant surge began. That means over 47 percent of our total cases so far occurred in just the past 5 months. See attached table to view the weekly new cases since July 1. Note that December to date numbers are not included and we have seen a rise in weekly case numbers so far this month.

Schools: We had 94 new school student cases over the past 4 weeks (compared to 130 the previous 4 weeks), for a total of 799 student cases so far this school year. So school numbers are still high, but slowing down a little. We had 24 new school staff cases over the past 4 weeks (compared to 22 the previous 4 weeks), for a total of 137 staff cases so far this school year. (See attached table.)

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Contact Tracing: PCG continues to keep up with attempts to interview positives, but many positives don't answer when they call, so they can't complete the interviews. We have been advised that as case numbers rise, they may no longer be able to keep up and we'll need to consider other protocols.

6. **COVID Vaccine:**

- Vaccine traffic has been down over the past month – 790 since the past board meeting, compared to 964 for the previous four weeks. Daily totals in the past 4 weeks have ranged from 14 to 79.
- We did 12 mobile clinics since the last board meeting (Clay schools, Heritage Pointe, Randall Residence, State Garage, Best Care, Northwest Schools, Bloom Vernon Schools, Minford Schools x 3, STEM Academy, and Scioto Residential Services). We have 2 or 3 more planned before the end of December.
- We did 5 evening clinics targeting pediatric clients since the last Board meeting. We are also doing pediatric vaccine during our normal business hours.
- We continue to do homebound shots when requested. Several per week. Occasional nursing home shots.
- We have been giving vaccines for 45 weeks. Vaccine totals to date:

7. **TOTAL TO DATE: 14688** (increase of 790 since October Board report)

Moderna: 9087 (increase of 477)
Pfizer: 4430 (increase of 153)
Janssen: 1021 (increase of 28)
Pedi Pfizer: 150 (increase of 132)

First doses: 6298 (increase of only 92 - does not include 13 Janssen.) Includes 69 pedi. This is very concerning; very few new people starting vaccine.

Second doses: 5923 (increase of 94)

Third doses for immunocompromised: 21 (increase of 1)

Boosters: 1472 (increase of 590)

8. **Other:**

Flu Cases: Flu season has started. We have not had any hospitalized flu cases reported yet in Scioto County but we have seen occasional reports of non-hospitalized flu positive tests. Over 100 hospitalized cases have been reported in Ohio so far this season. Non-hospitalized flu cases are not reportable to the Health Dept., so we don't know a total count of positive flu cases. ODH sent an alert last week that flu is here and is hitting young adults in congregate settings (e.g., college campuses) particularly hard.

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9. **Flu Shots:** So far, we've given 799 flu shots this season. Our flu shot numbers are down by about 115 shots compared to the same time period pre-pandemic. This decrease in flu vaccine uptake is a problem everywhere, not just SCHD. We still have plenty of standard flu vaccine, but only 21 doses left of High Dose for seniors.

10. Environmental Report – Gareth Bennett, Director




11. Health Commissioner's Report – Dr. Martin

Informed the Board that he met with officials that are actively monitoring the A-Plant. The Ohio EPA is monitoring effects from anything that is present on the site and the effects to neighboring communities.

The County is now suing the distributors of opioids. The term they are being referenced as is being a public nuisance. We have to figure out how to approach the situation from a public nuisance standpoint.

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SCIOTO COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH RESOLUTION

2022 RETAIL FOOD PROGRAM FEES

January 14, 2022

Whereas, the Scioto County Board of Health is required by the Ohio Administrative Code to conduct an annual cost methodology of the Retail Food Program and;

Whereas, the cost methodology completed in November 2021 requires for the decrease of license fees for all Risk Levels Commercial and Non-Commercial, Mobiles, Vending, Temporaries, and;

Whereas, the proposed license fee adjustments require three readings at regularly scheduled monthly Board of Health meetings with a public hearing held at least 20 days after giving written notice of the hearing to all persons or government entities holding a retail food license, and;

Whereas, the Scioto County Board of Health gave a first reading to the proposed fee changes at its regularly scheduled meeting on November 12, 2021 and;

Whereas, the Scioto County Board of Health gave a second reading to the proposed fee changes at its regularly scheduled meeting held December 10, 2021 and;

Whereas, public notice was given on November 17, 2021 at least 20 days prior to a public hearing held on December 16, 2021 and;

Whereas, the Scioto County Board of Health gave a third reading to the proposed fee changes on January 14, 2022 and passed the proposed fee changes as follows:

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
